

Tax Office warns of email scam

Police Credit Union has been advised of a new scam email doing the rounds, that appears to be from the Australian Tax Office (ATO) and requests that you supply personal information as well as credit card numbers.

The ATO has advised that the email is a hoax and that they do not need to request information in such a fashion.

This is a perfect example of yet another way scammers try and get enough personal information about someone in order to steal their ID and generally apply for credit.
